
<u>PATTY PERSHAYLA</u> is already a rarity as a combination singer and bassist, but has established herself as a stand-out performer by meanwhile perching on one leg or strutting the stage in platform heels. She is heard before she is seen, boasting a big voice for a relatively small vessel, and certainly has a lot to say—challenging gender norms, confronting imposter syndrome, processing trauma—and don't even think about getting on her bad side.



KAIT ROSE has been playing guitar and writing songs since the summer of 2001. Her writing is deeply personal and universal. We are extremely honored and excited to welcome Kait to her very first Ebird & Friends Holiday Show!



A once in a generation musician and public figure who combines her classical training with her love for American and Irish folk music. <u>KIANA JUNE WEBER</u> graduated early with a Bachelor's degree of music in violin performance from the University of Michigan School of Music, Theater, and Dance; and gave the commencement speech to her graduating class. At only 19, she was scouted by the violin troupe Barrage and toured internationally for three years. In 2012, she made a splash as the fiddler player in Celtic music's favorite band, Gaelic Storm, with whom she recorded 4 Billboard world No.1 albums. She left the band in 2017 to pursue her own career and toured as a special guest with Grammy award-winning artist, Carlos Nunez, and by 2018, she originated the role of fiddle on the First National tour of Broadway's hit Come From Away.



MARTIN HOWLEY is a co-founder of We Banjo 3, one of Ireland's most successful bands of the past two decades. Performing regularly to audiences of 15,000+, shows in 6 different languages, achieving multiple Billboard Chart No.1's, performing for international dignitaries (including US Presidents), he is also an entrepreneur, strategist, engineer, educator, and leader.



JESS MERRITT is a singer-songwriter whose rich, soulful vocals bring listeners on a spirited journey through life's truths – the joys, the trials and the "what is yet to be." Refusing to submit to a single genre, she pulls sounds from jazz, soul, classical, pop and R&B styles while cutting new paths with infusions of electronic beats and elevated harmonies. She finds inspiration in the natural world and the unapologetic roots which she has grown from. These influences blossom in expressions of selfdiscovery through her music and her many creative pursuits, from weaving fallen saplings into expansive land sculptures, to fiber art and furniture restoration. Over the past decade, Jess has performed at intimate venues and festivals across Michigan and has joined some of the state's greatest grassroots artists.



JEN SYGIT is a Lansing-based Independent Music Award winning songwriter. She has released four albums, her latest "It's About Time" produced by long time friend and collaborator Dominic John Davis (bassist to Jack White, Buddy Miller, Steppin' In It) and features guest performances from Luther Dickinson, Colin Linden, The McCrary Sisters and Rachael Davis. The album's title track won "Best Americana Song" at the 2019 Independent Music Awards in NYC and Jen's music video for the tune "Love is Wild", won "Vox Pop Fan Favorite" the same year. In addition to her career as performing songwriter, Jen is a founding member of the allfemale string band "Stella!" and you may have heard Jen sing on one of your other favorite artists albums- she is a veteran session vocalist appearing on over 50 albums nationwide.



Trumpeter and flugelhornist <u>ROSS HUFF</u> performs with a halfdozen different ensembles and maintains a docket of engagements playing most styles of contemporary music, as well as some futuristic and antiquated ones. Ross is active as a recording artist, arranger, composer, producer, music instructor, bandleader and sideman. His primary influences can be found in this concert program (see: B. Andes, E. Zindle, T. Haldeman) and he moonlights as a writer and editor.



JOHN TBONE PAXTON is a veteran trombonist and vocalist professionally active in Southeastern Michigan for many years. He is the featured singer and trombone soloist with the 11 time DMA award-winning jazz ensemble, the Planet D Nonet. He also co-leads the Paxton/Spangler Septet, a jazz ensemble performing primarily South African jazz, as well as an in demand quintet with Tbone as the featured artist. John is a 2nd generation musician and a son of the "Jazz Age." His soulful sense of swing, phrasing, and his ability to interpret and bring personal meaning to a lyric allows him to connect to his audience at an emotional level, both as a vocalist and as an instrumentalist. Look for his 2020 CD recording "Back in Your Own Backyard" on Detroit Music Factory records with the RJ Spangler Quartet. Thone has a new 2023 CD release, "Joys", on Eastlawn records. Both are available on Spotify, Apple, and Bandcamp as well as eastlawnrecords.com.



Saxophonist <u>TIM HALDEMAN</u> resides in Ann Arbor where he leads several groups of his own, and performs and records with a wide variety musicians. He is also a member of Mike Reed's People Places and Things and other Chicago projects.



For more than 15 years, <u>BRAD PHILLIPS</u> has had the pleasure of serving as a sideman for some of Michigan's most prevalent singer/songwriter acts. From Jeff Daniels, to The Verve Pipe, to the Celtic-fusion super-group Millish. He has appeared with May Erlewine, Joshua Davis, Rachel Davis; and played violin for Stevie Wonder, Aretha Franklin, Pat Metheny, and Iggy Pop and the Stooges. Brad is faculty at The University of Michigan Music School as a lecturer in the department of Jazz & Contemporary Improvisation and is a resident artist at the Purple Rose Theatre Company. For part of 2024 and now going into 2025, Brad will be on tour around the world with Patti Lupone!



<u>BRENNAN ANDES</u> has been a bon vivant of Ann Arbor's scene for the last two decades. He has had the pleasure of creating music for a plethora of artists as well as being the founding member of The Macpodz. Years of touring nationally and internationally has made him aware of the importance of the community around him. TJ ZINDLE TJ Zindle ignites a fearless spark of mighty altrock. A sonic explosion of spirited vocals, fiery electric guitars, and charged lyrics instantly propels listeners. A kinetic live performer, Zindle fronts The Powerlines and shares his sweaty, rambunctious energy with growing audiences nationwide. He's also the singer/songwriter from Buffalo, NY rock band, Last Conservative, and longtime guitarist/vocalist for Erin Zindle & The Ragbirds.



Keyboardist and drummer <u>LOREN KRANZ</u> stays busy making music year round - but especially so during the holiday show, where he plays keys in the house band! A part of the Ebird & Friends crew since 2010, he works with several projects, including Erin Zindle & The Ragbirds and Mark Lavengood Band. Loren will also recently began putting out music under his own name, with plans to release an EP in 2023. A native of Saginaw, Loren can be found serving his community through teaching at Major Chords for Minors, a nonprofit organization offering weekly 30-minute music lessons at no cost to underprivileged kids.



Percussionist <u>DAN PICCOLO</u> regularly performs and teaches in a wide range of musical settings. He has recorded and toured internationally as a concert percussionist, jazz drummer, and world percussion specialist. Dr. Piccolo frequently appears as a clinician at universities throughout the United States. JENNY JONES has been friends with Ebird for over 23 years and is a classically trained pianist, self-taught guitarist, and schooltaught cellist. She is a singer-songwriter based in Ann Arbor and has shared the stage with The War & Treaty, Michael Franti, Abigail Stauffer & The Wisdom, Kate Peterson, Nickie Price, Joe Reilly, Antwaun Stanley, Tunde Olaniran, and many others. Jenny is Co-Executive Director of Michigan nonprofit 'Title Track' alongside founder Seth Bernard and Holly T. Bird; contributes to the local music community holding positions as a board member of The Ark and The Amplify Project; as well as committee positions with the Ann Arbor Area Community Foundation, the Ann Arbor Summer Festival, and the Alluvion Artist Council.



ERIN ZINDLE is the songwriter, lead singer, and fiddler of the nationally-touring folk-rock band Erin Zindle & The Ragbirds. The four-piece project is clearly built around the multi-talented front woman who is proficient in a variety of stringed instruments, skillfully switching between violin, accordion, kalimba and piano, all while dancing. Erin has been performing and teaching violin and piano for many years, but spends most of her time touring and playing her original music. She was classically trained in her hometown of Buffalo, NY and has been performing with bands of many styles and sizes all across the US for over 17 years and is an accomplished songwriter (with a song reaching the Top Pop 100 in Japan). For the last 17 years I've been gathering my friends together to creatively collaborate around the theme of holiday music. Through this ongoing experiment we have forged our very own annual tradition and it has grown year after year.

People rarely appreciate the fact that there exists a giant book of songs from which so many of us can sing . It's a book of songs which share a common thread of hope as we prepare for the long winter ahead, covering a wide range of subjects and styles. Songs of a baby born to save all of humanity and a jolly old fat man who brings us the desires of our heart. Songs from of feasting, fasting, candles, and dancing. Songs of belief and doubt, loss and war, sugarplums, magic animals and chilly noses.

This tradition of gathering with those I love to sing from this collective songbook has been with me my whole life. In Buffalo, NY where I grew up my large family gathered together every snowy Christmas Eve and sang in harmony. Christmas was the only time this ever happened and these were my favorite childhood memories. I would learn every verse of each song so that I could keep the music going as long as possible. Over the years the Zindle family tradition slowly came to an end but I kept the embers of that experience and created something new, right here, with my musical Michigan family.

It is a gift and an honor that I have drawn into my life many widely diverse and especially talented friends. We have different styles, tastes, ideas, beliefs, and traditions. But we all have something to celebrate at this time of year, even if it's just the simple act of coming together. We share the love of music, and we truly enjoy each other's company. encouraging each other to shine in our own unique and beautiful ways.

With so much dividing us more and more every day, this entire "holiday season" can sometimes feel like one more ugly example of our disagreements. But in the last 17 years I have discovered something that I hope you will experience at this show, on stage and all around the room. It's our common desire for "Peace on earth - good will to men". It's the suspension of disbelief, the 'agree to disagree', the open ear, the armistice, the mingling of ideas old and new to the sound of a familiar tune. May this music fill you with joy.
